## *From Our Seminarian*

### *Our Assent to the Real Presence*

Amen. This simple, yet powerful word has become so common in today's language that it has lost its full impact as Christian assent. One of the few Hebrew words to have found its way into the Catholic liturgy, the word amen is frequently found uttered by Christ himself in the Gospels, especially when he wishes to add gravity to a particular statement (e.g., Jn 3:5, "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the Kingdom of God."). Given the fact that we say it so often in prayer and the liturgy, as well as its frequent use in secular expressions (Amen to that!), it is no wonder that we speak it ourselves without thinking about its meaning. Amen is used in many different ways in a Christian context, but today I would like to focus on the word amen as our assent to the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Blessed Sacrament.

As Catholics, we believe that Jesus Christ is substantially present in the consecrated host and wine. This is to say that through the power of the priest standing in the person of Christ, the bread and wine actually and really become the body, blood, soul, and divinity of Jesus. Nothing of bread and wine remain, save their physical characteristics. In even the smallest piece of the consecrated host, or the smallest drop of the Precious Blood, Jesus Christ is fully present. This is one of the great mysteries, and indeed a cornerstone of our faith.

The "Amen" we speak upon the reception of communion is not simply a formulaic, habitual response, but rather a grand statement of assent. We are immediately assenting to the Real Presence of Jesus Christ, but implicit in this response is assent to the entirety of the Catholic faith. We assent to the Doctrine, to the Creed, and to the Church's teaching on faith and morals. We are, essentially, publicly affirming our submission to Holy Mother Church and her teachings.

One's attitude and demeanor in receiving the Blessed Sacrament can speak volumes. Our witness is of particular gravity in the example we provide to our families and friends in how we attend mass and receive the Eucharist. It is important to let non-Catholic friends who may be attending Mass with you know that while we welcome their attendance, they cannot receive communion, regardless of what they may believe. At weddings, first communions,



Mass preceding a baptism and any other liturgical event where non-Catholics may be present, offer your guests the guidelines for the reception of Holy Communion which are available in the inside front cover of our parish missal. This has nothing to do with the person but is rather a testament to our belief in and respect for the Real Presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. None of us would dare to try to visit the Wailing Wall in Jerusalem without being properly attired and following the required guidelines. Mutual respect for each other's traditions and rules is to be expected. Unless one has been properly received into the Church, making the profession of faith, he or she cannot be expected to understand the full import of what we, as Catholics, assent to with our great "Amen."

On a related note, one of the best ways to express love and respect for Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament is through Eucharistic Adoration. Every first Friday at St. James, the Blessed Sacrament is exposed after the 8:30 a.m. Mass, ending with Benediction at 11:45 a.m. We invite you to come spend some quiet time in adoration before our Eucharistic Lord. If you have non-Catholic friends who are interested in or curious about our faith, this is a wonderful opportunity to show them our great respect for the Blessed Sacrament. Though they may not be able to physically receive communion, they are certainly able to make a spiritual communion, inviting Jesus into their hearts in a special way. This Friday, August 5th, is the first Friday of the month. Please stop by for a few minutes or more!
